Pearl Harbor

Eighty years ago this month, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and the United States entered World War II.

The following are excerpts from "U.S. PACIFIC SUBMARINES IN WORLD WAR II", by William P. Gruner that are a summary of the U.S. submarine war in the Pacific. It was written by William P. "Bud" Gruner Jr., class of 1935 in the US Naval Academy who eventually commanded USS SKATE during WW II. (https://maritime.org/doc/subsinpacific.htm)

USS TAUTOG (SS-199) (Duty. Officer, Barney Sieglaff) was moored at the Submarine Base, Pearl Harbor when the Japanese attacked on December 7, 1941. Sieglaff directed the manning of a .50 cal. machine gun. Pasqual Mignon, a torpedoman, shot down the first Japanese plane downed in the attack, the first kill of WWII.

U.S. World War II Submarine Operational Summary:

- Maximum number of U. S. Submarines in the Fleet = 288
- Number that made war patrols = 263
- Number of War Patrols made by Submarines in the Pacific = 1,474
- Number of days at sea by those Submarines = 70,838
- Number of Japanese ships attacked by submarines = 4,112
- Total number of Japanese ships sunk by submarines = 1,392
- Average number of merchant ships sunk/war patrol = 0.80
- Average number of naval vessels sunk/war patrol = 0.145
- Average number of all types of ships sunk/war patrol = 0.945
- Number of airmen rescued by Submarines = 504 by 86 Submarines
- Number of Submarines lost on war patrol = 41, or 1 out of every 6.41 S/Ms = 15.59%
- Number lost due all causes = 52 out of the 288 in the Fleet, or 1 out of every 5.54 Submarines = 18.06%
 - Number of U.S. Submarine Commanding Officers = 465
 - Duration of the war = 1,347 days

Additional information of the U. S. Submarine Forces efforts in WWII as described in the Wikipedia article "United States Submarine Veterans of World War II".

"The United States Navy Submarine Service lost 52 submarines, 374 officers and 3,131 enlisted men during World War II. These personnel losses represented 16% of the officer and 13% of the enlisted operational personnel. This loss rate was the highest among men and ships of any U.S. Navy unit.

Less than two percent of American sailors served in submarines, yet that small percentage of men and their boats sank 214 Japanese warships. This included 1 battleship, 4 large aircraft carriers, 4 small aircraft carriers, 3 heavy cruisers, 8 light cruisers, 43 destroyers, 23 large submarines and 1,178 merchant ships of more than 500 tons.

In all, U.S. submarines sank more than 55 percent of all Japanese ships sunk. More than surface ships, Navy air and the U.S. Army Air Corps combined."





Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz summarized their efforts after the war by writing:

"We, who survived World War II and were privileged to rejoin our loved ones at home, salute those gallant officers and men of our submarines who lost their lives in that long struggle. We shall never forget that it was our submarines that held the lines against the enemy while our fleets replaced losses and repaired wounds."
